**Regarding Late Entries:** Late pre-entry is defined as any pre-entry received after the local extension office closes on the pre-entry deadline date up until the day before the designated judging of that area. 4-H exhibitors that are late for pre-entry or late for fair check-in will be dropped one ribbon placing and are not eligible for Grand or Reserve Champion consideration.

4-H and FFA members who are intending to participate in their county Livestock Premium Sale or Project Auction must complete the following requirements:

- Attend a minimum of 3 Club Meetings
- Complete the YQCA training either in person or online
- Participate in 3 approved activities listed on the District Form.
   (FIRST year 4-H Members <u>ONLY</u>—are required to complete TWO approved activities )

Thursday, June 6th, 2024 at 5:30 pm at the Clay County Fairgrounds

Online training is also available at yqcaprogram.org. The online training can be completed any time prior to the July 1st deadline.

## **Photo Mounting Workshop**

If you will be in need of help with mounting your fair photos. We can help you out!

First, you will need to print your photos out as an 8 x 10 (can be cut down no smaller than 7" x 9". You can then purchase your mounting boards from your local Extension Office for \$1.25 each. The mounting board should always be in the portrait position and measure down 1" from the top and center the picture in the middle.

## Begin Now to Update Your Record Book & Plan to Complete a Project Record

This is just a reminder that summer is just around the corner with schools coming to the end. Everyone will have a little bit of down time, so we wanted to remind you if you haven't kept your 4-H permanent record up to date throughout the year, this would be a great time to work on it. Who likes to wait until mid-September to get started and have only a few days to get it turned into your community leader? The permanent record is a continuous record that grows with the 4-H member, as you add on to it year after year keeping track of everything you are doing whether it is 4-H or non-4-H related.

We would like to challenge, each River Valley District 4-H member to complete at least one project record this year. Here are some tips to get started:

- 1. Pick your favorite project
- 2. Set your goals that you would like to achieve
- 3. Keep track of any presentations you have given on that project. Did you do a talk at a project meeting, club days, or club meeting? Did you educate your class in school or at a community event?
- 4. What have you learned by researching, going to project meetings, or maybe a touring a business?
- 5. Can you teach someone else about what you know about your project? Hold a project meeting within your club, county or even open it up to anyone in the district to come learn. That's leadership!
- 6. Think outside of the box and do some citizenship projects related to your favorite project. Are Rabbits, your favorite project? See if you can take your rabbit project to a preschool or nursing home to share.
- 7. Every project has some kind of finances, whether you are buying supplies- expenses, or selling the end product-income. Say you are doing a Poultry project record; you are feeding those chicken's feed (expense) but you are also collecting, washing and selling eggs (income). Write this all down on a calendar each day you will be amazed at the outcome!
- 8. Write a story telling ALL ABOUT this project from the beginning to the end of the year. Be detailed, just like you are reading a book tell YOUR story to the reader.
- 9. Last but not least, take photos,. Have some one take pictures of you learning, teaching others (Leadership), and doing for others (Citizenship) in your project.

Remember that we mentioned at the start of this 4-H year - pin applications are requiring a project record be turned in. These project records are then exchanged with another county within our River Valley District to be judged. Attend your Achievement Day Celebrations to see if you WIN!!
